The National Institute for Advanced Studies in Security and Justice is a national administrative public institution placed under the supervision of the Prime Minister of the French Republic. The headquarters of the institution are based at the Ecole Militaire in Paris.

The INHESJ operates in the areas of training, academic study, research, strategic oversight and analysis in terms of homeland security, health, environmental and economic security, in addition to matters related to justice and legal issues.

The Institute, which is recognized as a place for partnership and as a crossroads of cultures,

offers a wide range of training for the benefit of public and private actors in the fields of security and justice, as well as for every person interested in these subjects.

The National Sessions permit the highlighting of the interactions that establish national security and enhance the links between justice and law enforcement, together with the issues of security and defence. The selected candidates (French as well as Overseas) for the national or regional sessions are appointed by Prime Ministerial decree from a list proposed by the Director of the Institute.

<i>Objectives</i>	To provide the directly operational theoretical knowledge and expertise required to understand the various threats that might challenge the sustainability of businesses.
<i>Audience</i>	Business leaders and company directors in the safety/security/EI sectors, crisis managers, etc.
<i>Qualification</i>	INHESJ diploma bestowing the title of Auditor of the Institute by Prime Ministerial decree Level I RNCP (French National Register of Professional Certifications) certification (equivalent of the baccalauréat + 5 years' higher education) as an 'Expert in Business Protection and Economic Intelligence'
<i>Volume</i>	252 hours over 9 weeks at 4 days a week
<i>Rates</i>	€3,500 - €7,000 depending on the applicant employment authority

<i>Objectives</i>	To produce and coordinate an effective risk and crisis management policy; to create the conditions required to foster a crisis culture adapted to the societal and economic constraints at play; to identify, characterise and manage a crisis; to communicate in a crisis situation.
